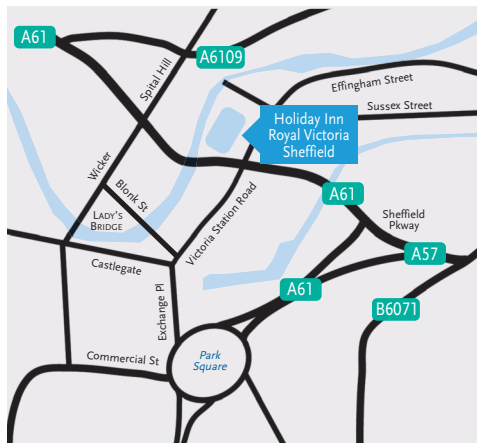
Welcome
